

Hong Kong officials meet after bird flu confirmed

(AP) -- Hong Kong has confirmed its first case of human bird flu in seven years.

Health Secretary York Chow said late Wednesday that a 59-year-old woman had tested positive for H5N1 <u>bird flu</u> after returning to Hong Kong from the Chinese mainland, and is in serious condition in a local hospital.

With the announcement, the government raised the bird flu alert to "serious," meaning there is a risk of contracting the disease within the territory.

Chow said Hong Kong officials were meeting Thursday and would determine whether additional measures are needed to safeguard local residents.

The <u>bird flu virus</u> first struck Hong Kong in 1997. Six people died in that <u>outbreak</u> and all chickens in the territory were culled.
